## Walking Like Jesus: March 3 Urban Ministry Conference

### **Tenth Church's long history of mission outreach**

"making disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19) encompasses global and local urban ministry. Tenth leaders, along with many theologians and Bible teachers, are aware of the vast problems plaguing urban areas and believe that solutions must come from the church. As Jesus is called Emmanuel, "God with us," so we are called to serve in the city and show Christ's mercy and compassion to its residents—we are to "Walk Like Jesus," the theme of this year's conference. Through the plenary session and six workshops, the conference will show what God's people—our city partners—are doing in our city and how they are "Walking Like Jesus."

**Where Jesus Walked (plenary session):** David Apple will point to places in Scripture (and also give current examples) where Jesus touched, healed, spoke, gave new life, and set the captives free. God calls us to "unwrap the grave cloths" of those who, though living, appear to be dead.

**When God moves into Philadelphia:** Pastors Súler Acosta and Gabriel Wang-Herrera minister "under the El" at Somerset and Kensington. This workshop will unpack their model of outreach and short-term missions and will offer examples of how this approach is working with human trafficking, ministry to drug addicts and the homeless, and community development.

**Experiencing Grace:** David White and Ellen Dykas, Harvest USA, will combine testimonies and biblical teaching to help attendees gain a better understanding of how the gospel addresses brokenness. This workshop will also provide a foundation for ministry so attendees are equipped to walk alongside men and women struggling with sexual and relational sin.

**Walking a Mile in the Addict's Shoes:** Heather Rice began volunteering at Whosoever Gospel Mission at the age of thirteen and never left its employ. She will share how God in his grace transformed her heart during eighteen years of working at this rescue mission with homeless and drug-addicted men.

### **Experiencing God While Serving His People:**

Cassandra Jackson of Esperanza Health Center came to Philadelphia specifically to do urban missions. Her workshop will examine how God's grace transformed one person's brokenness into the mission of working to develop rich and eternal mentoring relationships.

**Compassion, Not Condescension:** Doug Logan, the Epiphany Fellowship, Camden, church planter will lead a workshop to explore the biblical view of compassion. Looking at the ministry of compassion Jesus lived, led, and loved, participants will discover ways to move from looking down on people in need to calling them to look up to God through the gospel of Jesus Christ.

**Walking with Hagar and Her Children:** Karen Hess and Kim Bennett from Alpha Pregnancy Services will discuss how women and children are more vulnerable than ever. This workshop will help prepare attendees to answer hard questions about the value of life and teach strategies for ministering to the underserved.

**The Urban Ministry Conference** seeks to be a catalyst for this city church to think and act biblically and to be faithful followers of Christ in the city. To be a city church means that our thinking should be more like the thinking of Christ. To be a city church means that we become more sensitive to the needs of those around us. *Soli Deo Gloria* is a motto that has been used since the time of the Protestant Reformation. It is the culminating phrase of five "Solas" and means "Glory to God Alone." Recognizing that all glory belongs to God and that we, even at our best, are but instruments of His grace, is the true, Christian world-life view. Such was the perspective of the great church musician Johann Sebastian Bach (1685–1750), who regularly began his compositional work, whether sacred or secular, by writing "JJ" (*Jesu, juva*—"Jesus, help me") on the first page of a manuscript and "sDg" at the end.

Since 1995 we have employed this phrase as the title of our fifteen-minute musical prelude to evening worship. SDG affords musicians (singers and instrumentalists alike) the opportunity to give back to God from the gifts He has given them. At the same time, the music is intended to encourage the congregation and to be a public testimony of our desire as musicians to honor Him with our musical offerings. This even extends past vocal music with sacred text to the untexted beauty of instrumental music, which can also be offered to the glory of God. Through the doctrine of common grace, such music demonstrates for us not only the skill of the player, but also the creative genius with which God has endowed so many composers, whether or not they were conscious of this gift or were intentional in their use of it for His glory.

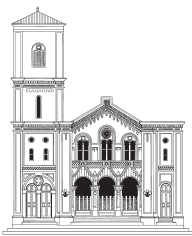

The church library is open after services in Catacombs room C3. The Alliance of Confessing Evangelicals runs the bookstore, open in Catacombs room C1 after services on Sundays only.
